"Photographing in the Falkland Islands:" A Presentation by Tom J. Ulrich at Montana House

The Montana House and the Glacier National Park Fund are pleased to co-host another in the series of "**Look, Listen & Learn**" programs at the Montana House in Apgar Village inside Glacier National Park. The featured photographer/author from West Glacier, Montana is Tom J. Ulrich with his presentation at 4:00 p.m. Saturday afternoon November 17, 2012.

Ulrich spent 6 weeks in the Falkland Islands about 700 miles off the southern tip of Argentina. He sometimes lived with the locals but much of the time stayed in shacks out near the bird colonies. This allowed him to photograph thousands of penguins, cormorants and albatross where he was literally within arm's distance. Photographic opportunities were endless. The program will run a little over an hour showing several hundred photos.

Ulrich has been a freelance and award winning photographer since 1975 and is highly acclaimed around the world for his nature photography skills, with many of his photographs appearing in numerous publications including National Wildlife, Audubon, and National Geographic. He is also the author of seven nature books, including Mammals of the Northern Rockies, Birds of the Northern Rockies, Once Upon a Frame, Photo Pantanal, Mt. Reynolds: The Story, Mammals of the Canadian Rockies, and Birds of the Canadian Rockies.

For many years Tom has been leading tours to remote parts of the world, such as Patagonia, Tierra del Fuego, Galapagos Islands, Costa Rica, and East Africa. Additionally, Tom also conducts photography seminars and workshops around the country and lectures at numerous institutions.

Hans and Toni Jungster established **The Montana House Regional Craft Shop** in 1960 in Apgar Village, just inside Glacier National Park. Their daughter, Monica and staff continue to carry on their mission: to celebrate and promote the creativity of Montana and Native American artists and craftsmen for our mutual benefit.
